Academic Scholarships

Jones County Junior College awards five categories of academic scholarships: ACT, Academic Excellence, Career and Technical Excellence, Junior Miss/Miss Hospitality, and Presidential Scholarships: Eligibility requirements for the academic scholarships are listed below.

ACT- Full tuition scholarships are awarded to those students who make a composite score of 26 or above. Students making a composite score of 29 or above also receive an additional \$200 credit for the purchase of books for the fall semester of both their freshman and sophomore years. Students making a 30 or above will additionally receive one-half of the room and board fee for the fall and spring semesters of both years. Students who do not live in the dorms may receive other considerations by contacting the Dean of Students. Half-tuition scholarships are awarded to students who make a composite score of 23, 24, or 25. Students scoring 21 and 22 will receive a \$200 per semester. ACT Scholarships awards are not to exceed enrollment in more than 4 semesters (Fall and Spring only).

Academic Excellence

Full-tuition scholarships are awarded to those Mississippi students who are among the top achievers in their high school graduating classes. Students who qualify for this scholarship must accept it during the fall semester immediately following high school graduation. Failure to do this will cause the student to forfeit the scholarship. The number of scholarships available per high school is based on the school's Mississippi High School Activities Association classification as follows:

1. Class AAAAA (5-A) – 5 scholarships down through the top 10 students.
2. Class AAAA (4-A) – 4 scholarships down through the top 8 students.
3. Class AAA (3-A) – 3 scholarships down through the top 6 students.
4. Class AA (2-A) and A (1-A) – 2 scholarships down through the top 4 students.
5. Academic Excellence scholarships awarded to students who attend private schools will be based on the classification the school would be in if it were a member of the MHSAA. Academies must be accredited by the Mississippi Private School Association in order to be eligible to present this scholarship.

Career and Technical Excellence

One full tuition scholarship is awarded to one Mississippi student at each of the nine

Jones County Junior College district vocational–technical centers, based on the high school vocational-technical counselor’s recommendation.

Junior Miss/Miss Hospitality

Full tuition scholarships are awarded to students who participate in the statewide Junior Miss or Miss Hospitality Pageants. Students who qualify for this scholarship must accept it during the fall semester immediately following its presentation. Failure to do this will result in forfeiture of the scholarship.

Presidential

All in-district Valedictorians and Salutatorians are eligible to apply for a Presidential Scholarship.

Academic Scholarship Regulations

A student can accept one academic scholarship from this group. A student may receive various service scholarships in addition to an academic scholarship. Service scholarships include annual staff, athletics, band, cheerleader, choir, and newspaper staff. The total combined value of the service scholarships may not exceed full tuition. Academic scholarships are valid for up to four semesters, excluding summer terms. Students must accept an academic scholarship during a fall term and attend that term in order to receive it during the spring term immediately following. Recipients must remain enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours to remain eligible for an academic scholarship. Recipients must maintain a current GPA of 2.5 on a minimum of 12 semester hours to remain eligible.
