### ASSOCIATE DEGREE PROGRAM

#### JCJC CURRICULUM SHEET

---

The JCJC Associate Degree Nursing Program consists of nursing and non-nursing courses granting college credit. The program of study qualifies the graduate to be eligible for the licensure examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN). Graduates are prepared to render competent patient-centered nursing care in a variety of health care settings.

Admission to the School of Nursing requires a separate application in addition to admission to the college. Selections for the Nursing Program are made by the AD Nursing Admissions Committee, using a competitive selection process. **Non-nursing courses may be taken prior to admission into the Nursing Program.** The student may apply to the program during the application time line regardless of how many courses have been taken.

The student is reminded that the CORE requirements for the ADN program shown below should be scheduled before other, non-nursing electives (see additional notes below). Nursing science courses are limited to nursing majors. Courses followed by an asterisk (\*) are CORE REQUIREMENTS for the ADN program.

The student should also consult the JCJC catalog for specific admissions procedures and other details concerning the program of study.

Note carefully the A & P prerequisite: Before enrolling in A & P I, a student must have a minimum ACT score of 21 on the Science component, or one of the following courses BIO 1134, 1144, 2414, or admission to a health related program at JCJC, or instructor's permission.

The student must be admitted to JCJC and must have completed an application for admission to the AD Nursing Program. There are two applications periods per year. Nursing Program applications are available in January for admission to the fall semester class and August for the spring semester class. The application deadline is April 1 for the spring application and October 1 for the fall application period.

Applicants must present a minimum overall grade point average of 2.0 or better on previous college work. An Enhanced ACT composite score of 18 or equivalent, if taken prior to 1989, is required.

Students not admitted to the Nursing Program may elect to enroll in regular academic courses but will not be permitted to enroll in nursing courses until they are formally admitted to the Nursing Program. It is to the student's advantage to apply to the ADN program regardless of the number of core requirements completed.

The student should see a pre-nursing advisor for schedule planning and approval of course selection to ensure that the appropriate courses for admission to the nursing program are completed within the shortest amount of time. Any student with an advisor not on the faculty in Nursing should request through Student Services a change to a pre-nursing advisor in the Associate Degree Nursing Division.

Students without an adequate high school math background, which includes a minimum of Algebra II, should enroll in a preparatory math course, such as Basic Math or Beginning Algebra prior to Intermediate Algebra or College Algebra. Preparatory math courses will not transfer to other institutions.

This CURRICULUM SHEET should be used to keep a careful record of grades for each of the courses and should be presented to the student's advisor for planning the schedule of courses each semester at JCJC.
