The Bobcats looked to score late in the first quarter, but settled for a 35-yard field goal attempt with 2:20 on the clock. Chancellor's boot was not good.

Shortly after that, sophomore Derek Welch of Taylorsville intercepted a Lion pass to return possession to the Maroon and Gold.

Jones got on the board with

14:25 remaining in the first half when Early James connected a 14-yard touchdown pass to Darius Dear. Chancellor's PAT kick put the Bobcats on top 7-6.

East Miss scored again with 11:04 to play in the first half when Pat Shed scored on a one-yard run. Dimino's PAT gave the Lions a 13-7 halftime lead.

However, the Bobcats returned with a better second half to claim the victory.

On the night Borne recorded his fourth and fifth touchdowns and rushed for 119 yards on 20 carries. James and Maurice Ducksworth also rushed for 59 and 38 yards respectively.

James completed 14 of 23 passes for 87 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Dear had seven receptions for 35 yards and one touchdown.

The Bobcats had 217 yards rushing on the night for a total of 304 yards of offense while the Lions had 326 yards.
