The sample program of study prepares the student interested in Landscape Architecture and Landscape Contracting for transfer to MSU to complete the Bachelor of Science degree. All pre-landscape architecture courses are expected to be completed prior to transfer into the 3-year professional program. The landscape contracting program is a 2-year program (total of 4 years).

Landscape Architecture is a design profession, concerned with the harmonious relationship of man and his environment. Thus, a student of this discipline learns how to apply the design process to discover how physical installations or activities of man can be placed upon the land in a fashion that accommodates man, functionally and aesthetically, and complements the environment.

Career opportunities for landscape architects include with private firms and in governmental agencies. The scope of this profession includes, but is not limited to, site planning for housing developments, shopping centers, malls, civic centers, industrial parks, campuses, motels, resort areas, country clubs, golf courses, and municipal, state, regional, and national parks.

LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE & LANDSCAPE CONTRACTING -- NOTES:

The landscape contractor is a specially trained contractor who provides the materials and services needed to make the landscape architect's project become a reality; and/or to provide the management, and maintenance needed to keep the project in prime condition after implementation.

Note that MSU indicates that certain specialized courses in horticulture may be completed in the summer prior to the junior year. The student should consult carefully with an advisor to plan on the transfer and completion of any core courses not covered in the sample curriculum.

Students without an adequate high school math background, which includes a minimum of Algebra II, should enroll in a preparatory math course, such as Basic Math, Beginning Algebra or Intermediate Algebra, prior to College Algebra. Preparatory math courses will not transfer to other institutions.

Additionally, students should plan to complete no more than half of the hours required for a bachelor's degree prior to transferring to the senior institution. The student should consult the catalog of the senior institution for specific admissions procedures and other details concerning the program of study.

This CHECK SHEET should be used to keep a careful record of grades for each of the courses and should be presented to the student's advisor for planning the schedule of courses each semester at JCJC.
