SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY/AUDIOLOGY & DEAF EDUCATION -- NOTES:

The sample program of study on the reverse prepares the student to enter further studies in speech-language pathology and audiology at USM and UM.

Science Requirement. For USM, select 8 semester hours of laboratory sciences. Additionally, select one other laboratory science course so that at least two departments are represented or one additional math course above College Algebra.

Math. UM requires a second math course; trigonometry or calculus is appropriate. Students without an adequate high school math background, which includes a minimum of Algebra II, should enroll in a preparatory math course, such as Basic Math, Beginning Algebra or Intermediate Algebra, prior to College Algebra. Preparatory math courses will not transfer to other institutions.

Deaf Education emphasis is available at USM. The curriculum for Deaf Education across the freshman and sophomore years is identical in the USM catalog to the program of study suggested for Speech/Language Pathology and Audiology majors.

Foreign Language. For the UM foreign language requirement, choose four courses in either French or Spanish. USM requires a total of 9 hrs. All foreign language courses should be completed on the same college campus. As shown on the reverse, sign language may be substituted at USM.

Students should plan to complete no more than half of the hours required for the bachelor's degree prior to transferring to the senior institution. The student should consult the catalog of the senior institution for specific admissions procedures and other details concerning the program of study. A maximum of 67 hours may be transferred to USM, and maximum of 63 hours may be transferred to UM.

This CHECK SHEET should be used to keep a careful record of grades for each of the courses and should be presented to the student's advisor for planning the schedule of courses each semester at JCJC.
