



## **Academic Scholarships**

### **2020-2021**

#### **Presidential Scholarship**

*Awarded to in-state Valedictorians and Salutatorians with a composite ACT score of 21 or higher*

The Presidential scholarship covers tuition, housing fees, and \$500 per semester toward fees/books. An optional meal ticket is available for commuters. Scholarship must be accepted for fall semester immediately following high school graduation.

\*For first time incoming freshmen for the school year

#### **Academic Excellence Scholarships**

*\$1875 per semester awarded to top students in the graduating class of Mississippi high schools*

Scholarships available per schools, based on Mississippi High School Activities Association classifications, are the following:

6A- top 6 students

5A- top 5 students

4A- top 4 students

3A- top 3 students

2A & 1A- top 2 students

Academies- MHSAA classification most closely fitting enrollment

Scholarship must be accepted for the fall semester immediately following high school graduation.

## **Academic Scholarships**

### **2020-2021**

#### **ACT Scholarships**

- 21-22 – \$470
- 23-25 – \$940
- 26-28 – \$1875
- 29+ - \$2375 and half room and board for students choosing to live on campus; 29+ students accepted into the Honors Institute will receive up to an additional \$500.

**\*\*ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS** may NOT be combined. (Student may accept only one.) Scholarships are good for four (4) semesters. Scholarships cannot be redeemed for cash value or distributed as a refund.

**\*\*\*PRESIDENTIALS** and **HONORS** recipients must maintain a 3.0 GPA in 15 semester hours to remain eligible. All other scholarship recipients must maintain a 2.5 GPA in 15 semester hours. Exceptions on semester hours may be made for students in certain CTE programs.

Awards are based on the highest composite score. Super scores may not be used for determining scholarship eligibility. Scholarship must be accepted within one (1) year of high school graduation.

## Career and Technical Scholarships 2020-2021

### **Half Tuition Scholarship:**

- Eligible for up to \$940 toward tuition
- Legal resident of Mississippi
- High School diploma
- Complete a two-year secondary CTE program with an overall high school GPA 3.0
- First time student entering as a freshman
- Enroll in a minimum of 15 hours each semester
- Enroll within one year of high school graduation
- Must maintain a 2.5 GPA each semester
- Students are expected to enroll in a CTE program at Jones College.

### **Full Tuition Scholarship:**

- Eligible for up to \$1875 toward tuition
- Legal resident of Mississippi
- High School diploma
- Complete a two-year secondary CTE program with an overall high school GPA 3.5
- First time student entering as a freshman
- Enroll in a minimum of 15 hours each semester
- Enroll within one year of high school graduation
- Must maintain a 2.5 GPA each semester
- Students are expected to enroll in a CTE program at Jones College.



**The general criteria applying to Institutional Scholarships is as follows:**

- **Scholarships are valid for four semesters and DO NOT apply towards out-of-state fee.**
- **Scholarship recipients are expected to remain enrolled in a minimum of 15 hours until the completion of the semester. (Exceptions on semester hours may be made for students in certain CTE programs.)**
- **Scholarships recipients must pass 15 semester hours with a 3.0 semester GPA to remain eligible for scholarship.**
- **Scholarship recipients should abide by the College Code of Conduct.**
- **Institutional scholarships can cover up to \$1875 for students enrolled in 15-21 hours.**

Please understand that failure to complete the semester or failure to comply with the terms will result in the revocation of scholarships and the student may be required to repay all applicable charges. Students may be removed from school for the violation of the Code of Conduct as listed in the Student Handbook of Jones County Junior College and that upon such removal will be required to repay all applicable charges.

**Institutional scholarships cannot exceed institutional costs. Scholarships may be reduced based on Federal Financial Aid guidelines as well as state and local policies. The board reserves the right to change any and all fees at any point in the semester.**

**Scholarships cannot be redeemed for cash value or distributed as a refund.**
